★ CAPTAIN'S CORNER ★

Howdy Pard,

Well, Range War for 2012 is in the can. As everyone knows it takes a fair amount of work to put on a state match including a lot of help from a lot of people. I would like to express my sincere thanks and appreciation for everyone who pitched in to help make Range War one of the premier Cowboy Action Shooting State Championships in the country. We should all be very proud.

I would note that I went down to the Indiana State Championship during the second weekend in September and I heard many compliments about Range War. I was even asked, "What is your guys' secret?" My answer was that we have the best Match Director in Deuce Stevens and we understand that we are in the entertainment business. I think that the key ingredient for putting on a good CAS State Championship is to first have a high quality CAS match with high quality stages that shooters want to shoot. This is where it starts. You can do everything else right but if your stages are bad, you will have a problem. Eventually you will see your registration numbers dwindling.

We also try to stay ahead of the curve with many of the things we do for Range War. We will continue to post our stages in advance of the Match. As far as I know we were the first big match to do that. We also post our entire Shooter's Handbook on the website so any shooter can download and print it in advance of the Match if they want to. Cosmopolitan Christine implemented on-line registration this year with the ability to pay on-line with Pay Pal. This went over very well and I believe that we are the first big match to do that.

We had a total of 249 registered shooters and 35 shooters or 14% shot the match clean. A clean shooter is a happy shooter. Not everyone can win but everyone can shoot a clean match. Shooters want to have a good time shooting the match and it is more

fun when you can hit the targets. In Indiana they had one stage where the rifle targets were 12 x 12 and about 25 yards out. You will not see that at Range War. There were a lot of misses on that stage including 3 from yours truly.

I have said this before (including above) and I will say it again. I think that we have the best Match Director in the business in Deuce Stevens. I doubt that any other Match Director puts in half the amount of time (including thought time which is most important) that Deuce does. No one is perfect but Deuce really tries to do the best job that he can for each stage. The shooters definitely appreciate it. While I am on the topic of Deuce I will add one more thing. It is a credit to Deuce that he can muster the help to do the set up and take down, to get quality posse marshals, and to get the match work done. Managing people is a big part of this and Deuce does an excellent job at it. We both recognize that having a good match is not about a power trip for the Match Director or for the Captain. It is all about doing the best job that we can for our customers, the shooters. Our satisfaction comes from doing the best job that we can for them.

We did have some problems and we will try to get those fixed for next year. One of the biggest problems was that our banquet did not turn out as well as we would have liked. This was my fault for not booking Alexanders' immediately after last year's Range War. The food was fair, the service was fair, and the sound system was bad. It was not the worst banquet that I have been to but it was not up to our standards. We have Alexanders' booked for next year. I would also note that we are seriously looking into having our banquet in 2014 at Fore Lakes Golf Club. It is located on I 69 and Wadham's Road a few minutes from the Range. They can seat 500 and the price is very competitive. Actually, Fore Lakes would have been less than we paid at the banquet this year and the same as we paid at Alexanders' in 2011. www.forelakes.com. The banquet room is spectacular and the view from the balcony outside of the banquet is even better. Let me know what you think about that.

One of the things we do each year (which I think all big matches should do) is have comment cards that we ask the shooters to complete so that we can get feedback. Cosmopolitan Christine takes all of the comment cards and then summarizes the comments and they are emailed to all Board members. We review all of the comments and try to address issues that need to be addressed for the following year. The results of the comments cards (about 100 responses) for this year are as follows: Overall Experience – 93%; Registration – 98%; Side Matches – 90%; Stage Scenarios 93%; Food Vendor – 74%; Vendors – 85%; Range Facility – 93%; Saturday Dinner – 84%; Saturday Entertainment – 95%; Banquet – 68%; and the average grade – 87%. We will be fixing the banquet by moving back to Alexanders' and I will be working with The Angry Bull to make sure that they increase their time on the range for meals which was one of the big complaints.





Nine Finger Bob also shot the only clean WB match recorded for the day. The top WB Women's Traditional winner was Buslin' Belle followed by the WB Women's Modern winner Sassy Sue. DSC offers an open class for all shooters to come out and try Wild Bunch shooting even if you don't have all the proper equipment. This class is called the WB Open and it offered at every match. The winner of our WB Open class was DSC's John Weston.


STRAIGHT SHOTS FROM SAGINAW

★ COWBOY MUSINGS ★

I have been thinking about the rank scoring system utilized by SASS in major matches and I thought that I would share some of my thoughts. Rank scoring assigns a rank number for each shooter based on where he or she finished in relation to the other shooters for each stage shot in a major match. It is my opinion that Rank Scoring is in effect a handicap system used to reward the consistent shooter at the expense of a faster but perhaps less consistent shooter. I am under no illusions that SASS will discontinue Rank Scoring but I decided to offer my 2 cents on this for whatever it is worth. The main problem that I have with it is that it is different from just about any other competition that I am familiar with. I will state that I am not an IPSC shooter and the only shooting competition I have ever been involved in is Cowboy Action Shooting. I therefore do not know how this fits in with the other shooting disciplines.

If we were to look at other typical athletic competitions such as track and field, swimming, baseball, football, golf, etc., the competitor with the fastest time or the highest score or the lowest score (golf) is the winner. No one cares which competitor was the most consistent if he or she did not cross the finish line ahead of all of the other competitors. I realize that we participate in a fantasy game which is based on the theory that we are, in effect, reenacting gun fights from the Old West. One may say that it doesn't matter who is the fastest in a gunfight if he or she doesn't shoot the other person in the gunfight. That may be true but if one shooter gets off 2 shots and the second one hits the other shooter before the slower shooter hits with his first shot then the faster shooter wins.

One of my favorite past times is golf. (In fact I would be a better shooter if I practiced shooting as much as I practice golf. I am okay with that.) If one golfer shoots all pars and another shooter shoots some bogies but also has some birdies and maybe an eagle, the par shooter doesn't win unless he has the lowest score or won the most holes if it is match play. Why should Cowboy Action Shooting be any different? To me, rank scoring is a way for someone who is not the fastest shooter to be able to beat the faster shooter. What is the policy reason for rewarding the slower but more consistent shooter? I have not been able to figure that one out.

We have penalties for missing. If the faster shooter can finish with a faster overall time than the slower shooter even if he or she has a miss or two, then I think that faster shooter should win. Maybe it is a little bit of ageism at work. We older guys have a hard time keeping up with the young whippersnappers. Maybe rank scoring is a way for the old guys to have a more level playing field with the younger guys? This, however, seems to go against our goal of getting more younger shooters involved in our sport. Speed is good. I wish I had more of it.

I would say that I have no personal investment in this one way or the other because I hardly ever win anything. Rank Scoring versus Total Time probably doesn't result in much of a difference in who wins a match in most cases. Why not let our shooters let it all hang out and go for broke or "**FREESTYLE**" as the notorious Fireball sometimes calls it? If is fun to watch someone go all out. Rank Scoring tends to force some shooters to dial it back somewhat because they get penalized for mistakes. Again, I don't understand the policy reason for that. I think that we should let the shooters loose and let them have at it. If someone can miss and still be the fastest shooter then why shouldn't they win?

Anyway, those are the musings of Cowboy Action Shooter.
