The day started with a poker game side match. While seated at a card table, shooters engaged five targets Duelist Style, while holding a poker hand. Mr. Beer Belly Willy outclassed eleven other shooters cleanly hitting all five targets in 6.70 seconds.

Crossfire Trail starring Tom Selleck was Panhead Pete's inspiration for the main match. Tom Selleck has nothing on Snuffy Dave Edwards. Snuffy Dave scored three bonuses in his route of the field, with an adjusted time of 115.04. Clean matches were turned in by Dodge City Dick, Mr. Beer Belly Willy and Henry Moonshine.

During the match, a discussion arose regarding the function of spotters. Specifically as to whether or not there should be discussion between the spotters as to what they saw and what the resulting ruling should be. According to the ROII handbook "(T)he shooter is the ONLY person who may question a call made by any of the Range Officers on the line. "... "The Chief Range Officer shall politely discuss any discrepancies or questions with regard to safety, penalties, or rules with the shooter. In an effort to resolve any discrepancies, The Chief Range Officer should ONLY include other assigned Posse Officials in these discussions." In other words, call them as you see them. If the shooter questions the call, it is the Chief Range Officer's job to step in and resolve the situation. It is important to remember that benefit of the doubt always goes to the shooter.

Our next match is August 27. Inspiration is from the John Wayne movie Chisum. John Chisum was born August 15, 1824. Make sure to bring some extra pistol ammunition for our Wild Bill side match. You may want to dust off your 1851 Navy and make a little smoke.

Until we meet again, remember, you gotta do your own ropin, no matter how good your Daddy was.
