RE: Update

I would like to express the sincere thanks and appreciation of the Kimberly Anne Gillary Foundation and of my family for the continuous support of our mission by the Wolverine Rangers to ensure that every high school in Michigan has an automated external defibrillator (AED) and staff members certified in CPR and the use of an AED. To date we have raised over \$36,064.00 in donations from the cowboy shooters in the State of Michigan over the last 8 years. This includes money raised from the Charity Raffle at Range War as well as from special fundraising done by the Saginaw Field & Stream Club Cowboys, the Lapeer County Wranglers, the Eagleville Cowboys, and individual donations from Wolverine Ranger members.

As a result of the donations made during Range War over the past 8 years, we were able to purchase AEDs and training for the following schools: *Madison Academy High School (Burton), Romulus High School, International Academy of Flint, St. Thomas More Academy (Burton), North Hills Classical Academy (Grand Rapids), The Valley School (Flint), Gwinn High School, Suttons Bay High School, Saginaw Career Complex, Merrill High School, Heritage High School (Saginaw), Warsaw Community High School (IN), Hamilton High School, Hemlock High School, Hale High School, Durand Area High School, Wolverine Community High School, Mackinaw City High School, and Marysville High School.* All of these donations credited the contribution of the Wolverine Rangers. The funds raised by the Saginaw Field & Stream Club Cowboys, the Lapeer County Wranglers and the Eagleville Cowboys were put into our general fund and were used to provide AEDs and training to other Michigan high schools.

The Kimberly Anne Gillary Foundation makes a gift of the AED to the school and pays for certified CPR/AED training for 5 staff members. The only conditions of the gift are that the school agrees to have five staff members receive CPR/AED certification and a short AED in-service presentation be held at the school in front of faculty and staff when the AED is delivered.

On April 22, 2009, 67 year old Larry Ratkowski of the Hamilton area suffered a cardiac arrest between baseball games at a freshman double-header between Holland and Hamilton high schools. Bystanders performed CPR and restarted his heart with the school's defibrillator that was purchased with funds raised from the Charity Raffle at Range War 2005.

We were encouraged to find out that since the incident, the Hamilton school district has decided to purchase 3 additional AEDs to place in strategic locations throughout the district. They have

also purchased an AED training device and currently have a certified trainer on staff that will assist with the training.

To date we have received over \$1,110,000.00 from generous contributors such as the Wolverine Rangers and its members, and have donated over 550 AEDs to Michigan schools. We are a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization and all contributions to our Foundation are tax exempt. All of the administrative expenses of the Foundation are paid by the Law Offices of Randall J. Gillary, P.C. Accordingly, for every dollar donated to the Foundation, a dollar is spent on AEDs or training.

Thanks again for your continued support of our mission.
