Brass Rats

Here at the Rockford Regulators, we came up with an idea that has worked wonderfully for us. I would like to take this opportunity to pass it along to the other clubs. We have what we call "Brass Rats" at Rockford. No, it is not some kind of vermin infestation, it is a really well accepted and appreciated tradition here. We have about three or four of our younger folks that their job is to pick up brass after the shooter has left the shooting line.

I will use my niece, Dana, as my example. Dana is 15 years old. She has been a Brass Rat since we started this shoot. The age can vary according to the maturity of the individual. But as said, the

shooter leaves the shooting line and the Brass Rat comes up with a little plastic basket that we buy at the dollar store and collects the brass and shotgun hulls. They then go to the unloading table and if necessary carry the brass to the shooter's gun cart. By that time the next shooter has finished that stage and it is time for the Brass Rat to go back to work picking up that shooter's brass.

At the end of the match at dinner time, we have a bucket by the door where the shooters come in so they can kick in a buck or two or We also pass it around so the ones that didn't see it on the way in can contribute if they like. That money is then divided among the Brass Rats that worked that day.

The kids make pretty good money and us fat guys don't have to grunt and strain bending over to pick up all that brass. Sometimes with the gun belts on it is really uncomfortable not to mention possibly unsafe to be bending over to pick up brass. That also leaves more posse members to score, spot misses, and work the loading and unloading tables.

All I can say is it works like a charm for us and we constantly get positive remarks on having our Brass Rat program. We have bright yellow t-shirts with BRASS RAT printed on them to make them easy to pick out of the cowboy crowd. We make sure that anyone that is working as a Brass Rat understands when to go up to the line and what the hazards of working in close proximity to the firing line are. Dana has been hit with lead and completely understands the need for hearing and eye protection.

I would recommend this program for other clubs, with the provision that they properly train and equip the youngsters that will be doing this job. My advice is to pick them wisely with maturity in mind. This is not a job for one to take lightly. They must have some interest in what is going on around them and be able to keep a focus on the job at hand.

The bore is very good to excellent (sharp rifling with no pits) the bluing about 60%. Mechanically the gun is excellent. The wood shows some dings. Has Marbles front sight but I have the original.
