Howdy Rangers. The shooting season is well under way. Most of our member clubs have begun shooting for the year and more will have started before you read this.

I have attended matches at Rockford, Ionia, Hastings, Grand Rapids, Midland, Breckenridge, Plymouth, Utica, and Saginaw so far this year. All I can say is that all of these clubs are improving constantly. All of the matches were well run and every club has improved over last year. Michigan is proving to be a great place for cowboy action shooters. My biggest problem is that they make it tough to stick to my diet. All of my cowboy clothes are becoming a tad snug.

I do want to suggest that you make an effort to shoot at Sucker Creek (Breckenridge) if the opportunity presents itself. It is hard to believe that this last match was only their 2nd shoot. The folks there have created some interesting props and scenarios. Cree Vicar Dave is a very inventive and talented craftsman, and his props are impressive and useful. I suspect that many of us will borrow his concept for staging long guns horizontally. I have been recruiting him to build props for WRRW 2005.

Plymouth held a match on May 21 and it is hard to believe that this club is as new as it is. The match was very well run and offered some unique vendors. It is my understanding that they will try to continue with these and other vendors at each match. This is another match that you should try.

As promised, I am going to remind you about WRRW 2005 again. We still need volunteers to run side matches on Friday, September 2 which are set up in 2-hour shifts. Each club will have a copy of the side match sign-up book. When you register at your next match ask if they have received their copy of the book and please sign-up to help out.

We also need posse leaders. Posse leaders must have RO1 training and I suggest that you recruit an assistant to help you out. There will be a posse leader walk-thru on Friday evening to insure that we are all on the same page.

Please remember that we want WRRW 2005 to follow the lead of our member clubs and to improve each year. The best way to insure that is to encourage new ideas from our members and provide enough hands so that the same members do not do all of the work every year. New blood is always a good thing and if I might quote Table Top Tom, "Many hands make light work."

We also need to have each club submit a stage or stages for WRRW 2005. When you submit a stage,

be aware that the Rangers will provide the shotgun and pistol targets. You are asked to provide the props, rifle targets, and any special targets that you require for your stage. We have a dual theme this year. Our stages will be based on the movies "OPEN RANGE" and "CROSSFIRE TRAIL".

The Epitaph is a vital communication tool of the Wolverine Rangers and for those without Internet access it is the only means of keeping informed.
