#### Showdown On North Darr Road

It was the last of seven monthly Cowboy Action Shooting matches put on by the Mason County Marshals at the Fin & Feather Club north of Scottville. Turn out was small, but the fun was large and the competition tight. The five stages were won by 4 different shooters. Deuce's Uncle Johnny, a.k.a. John Schrotenbuer from Zeeland turned in the fastest time on stage one to take an early lead. Stage two was won by I.V. Drip, a.k.a. Ralph Briese from Hesperia, but misses on other stages knocked him out of contention for the top spot, he did hold on to the top spot in the Traditional category. Stage three saw Two Gun Troll, a.k.a. Roger Lehrbass from Custer blaze to the top spot. Uncle Johnny captured stage four but Two Gun Troll was matching him shot for shot having finished second in three of the prior stages while

Uncle Johnny had two firsts and two thirds in the prior stages.

The stage was set for the final showdown on stage five. It was a stage with a lot of movement that favored the younger legs of the Troll. Of the two shooters, Uncle Johnny shot first. He shot fast but had one miss and also missed the bonus, the fifth round from the second pistol placed on the bell located at the back of the shooting bay. Two Gun followed him to the line, the door was open, he knew what he had to do. Shoot steady and clean. He shot the rifle clean, shot the pistols clean and hit the bell for the bonus. Moving quickly to the left he picked up his 97 and tossed a shell into the chamber. It bounced out. Concentrating on the target he didn't notice and pulled the trigger. Bad primer, he thought and pulled the hammer back to try again. It slipped from his thumb only making it the half cock position, the gun wouldn't fire or cock. Aided by a shout from a spotter that the shell was on the ground Troll finally got the action open and inserted another shell and finished the round. Two Gun shot the match clean and got the bonus but the shotgun fumble was costly.

When the smoke had cleared Andy Horshurodinon a.k.a. Mike Day who rode for over three hours from Gaines, won the stage and finished first in the Gunfighter category and third over all. Two Gun Troll won the 49'er category but fell short of the overall title by 55 hundredths of a second. Deuce's Uncle Johnny had prevailed taking the Elder Statesman category and the match. These fine shooters were followed closely by several others including Hondo Dan a.k.a. Dan Hahn from Manistee who won the Frontier Cartridge Duelist category and his wife Miss Elaineous, a.k.a. Elaine, who won the Frontier Cartridge Ladies. Shooting in only his second shoot, Tom Bones, a.k.a. Tom Shepardson from Scottville improved steadily as the day wore on placing him first in the Senior category and fifth overall. Kewadin Kid, a.k.a. R. Hoadley, from where else but Kewadin was sixth overall and second in Gunfighter. Rounding out the field were, Slim Chance a.k.a.

Harold Hansen, finishing second in the Senior category, and Wildcat Slowdown, a.k.a., Paul Markov, who finished second in Senior category, both from Ludington.

This year we had 110 shooters from all over the state come to the Fin & Feather Club to participate in Cowboy Action Shooting. We plan to hold shoots in 2007 during the months of April to October on the second Saturday of the month, so mark your calendar. Thanks to all who participated and helped, for a great year. 


