The A.P. Goodrich Rifle and Pistol Club is happy to be a Wolverine Ranger Affiliated Club. Our club has always held Silhouette matches for centerfire pistol, a high power rifle, .22 cal. Pistol and rifle and black powder cartridge rifle. Some of our B.P. Ctg. Shooters were also Cowboys so we decided to have 2 shoots in 2006 where we invited a limited number of new cowboys to come up and shoot their big single shot rifles with us. We shot regulation size chickens offhand at 200 meters, then pigs at 300 meters, turkeys at 385 meters and rams at 500 meters from prone or sitting cross sticks. They enjoyed themselves so much we decided to make the 2 shoots annual events, to be held this year on June 9 and August 11.

With the popularity of Cowboy Silhouette growing out West by leaps and bounds, we got permission this year to hold the first Wolverine Ranger Cowboy Silhouette Championships ever held in Michigan. The events will be held on Sept. 29-30 rain or shine (we have a covered firing line) on Saturday morning Sept. 29 we will have the cowboy .22 cal

Lever Gun Silhouette Championship match, and in the afternoon we will hold the Cowboy Pistol Caliber Lever Gun Silhouette Championship match. Sunday's Championship event will be for Cowboy Long Range Single Shot Rifle Silhouette Shooters. We are really excited about offering the Cowboys in Michigan a new type of shooting event to participate in. I think the Single Shot Shooters will be especially pleased, because now they have an opportunity to really use their rifles as they were intended to be shot. At long range!

There's more good news for single shot shooters. The Rocky River Regulators at the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress are hosting the first ever Wolverine Ranger Cowboy Single Shot Rifle Short Range State Championship at 11:00 on July 22. The event will consist of 3 stages, 15 shots offhand in 15 minutes, 15 shots from sitting or kneeling cross-sticks in 15 minutes, and 15 shots prone from cross-sticks or front rest in 15 minutes, all stages shot at 200 yards from our covered range, rain or shine. This match was designed to test the all-round shooting skills of the Michigan Cowpokes, who are students of the single shot rifle. If all you have is a rifle caliber lever gun you are welcome to shoot the match as long as you load and fire one round at a time
