As of this writing, we just finished our 'Annual Hawaiian Shoot', It was, as always, a fun time.



2007 Clean Match Program

The 2007 Clean Match Program was expanded this year to two trophies, one for the women and one for the men. Sunday, July 22 dawned bright and sunny for the first ever Cowboy Single Shot Rifle Short Range State Championship. Cowpokes from all over made the journey to the beautiful Detroit Sports Congress; 200 yard covered range to find out who would claim the honors of being the top 3 Cowboy Short Range Riflemen in the State.

First though, I must offer an explanation of "Short Range" to set things straight. Historically in America shooting at 200 yards and under was classified as short range. Firing at targets from 300 to 600 yards was mid-range and anything over 700 yards was considered Long Range. I suppose we'll just carry on the tradition and call 200 yards what it is ... short range.

The first stage of the match called for the pards to fire 15 shots in 20 minutes from the prone position using cross sticks or other front rests. They really had a chance to zero in their rifles from this position because it is the steadiest position to shoot from. After they posted their targets for the next stage, the cowpokes got to fire 15 shots from the sitting position using cross sticks just like the Buffalo Hunters did. This position is not as steady as the prone position so it took a steady hand and lots of concentration to keep their groups from opening up. The last and hardest part of the match was firing from the standing or offhand position. This was what really separated the men from the boys! It was really fun listening to comments like "I was as steady as a rock but that dang target was moving all over the place!"

After the last stage was over and the Hi-walls, Rolling blocks and Sharps rifles were cleaned and put away, the cowpokes got to relax and swap stories while the targets were scored and the results posted. The highest scorer in the prone stage was shot by Moe Gunns, High score in the sitting stage was fired by Moe Gunns again, and top score in the difficult offhand stage was made by Cold Coffee Jack. The third place aggregate award went to

the Scholfield Ranger who fired a 318-1X. Second place agg. Was won by Moe Gunns who posted a 333-2X and the 2007 Cowboy Single Shot Rifle Short Range State Champion was Terrebonne Bud who won with a very respectable Agg. Score of 342-1X. Congratulations on your fine shooting and many thanks to all of you for attending!

All of you Cowboy Single Shot Shooters are invited up to Ithaca, MI. on Sat. Aug. 11 to shoot Silhouette with us. We shoot chickens offhand at 200 meters, the 300M pigs, 385M turkeys and 500M rams are all shot from sitting or prone x-sticks. All of the Cowboys shoot in their own class and get separate awards. Don't feel intimidated because of the distances we shoot, the size of the silhouettes or not having any sight settings. We will have you happily blazing away in no time flat! There will also be an offhand center fire lever gun silhouette match that will start immediately after the single shot award ceremony. Distances will be 40-60-75 and 100 yards at reduced size steel critters.

The first ever Cowboy Silhouette State Championship will be held on Sept. 29-30 at A.P. Goodrich. Saturday mornings silhouette event will be for .22 cal. Lever guns and the afternoon match will be for pistol caliber lever guns.

These lever gun events always appeal to those cowpokes who really enjoy shooting offhand with a rifle. Sunday's match will be devoted to the big cowboy single shot rifles. This event will appeal to riflemen who want to put their rifles and themselves to the ultimate test of marksmanship. 
