CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Howdy everyone. Range War will be here soon and we are completing our preparations. This is our 10th Anniversary and our plans are to make this a fun shoot. We have decided to stick with 10 stages this year rather than to try to shoot 12. We had some logistical concerns as well as some concerns about some of our younger shooters not being able to keep up with the older folks for 12 stages.

Be sure to bring enough ammo. You can figure on 10 rifle, 10 pistol and 4 shotgun shells for each stage as a bare minimum. You will need to also include ammo for side matches and for those unforeseen circumstances that are bound to happen. No one wants to be caught at a gun fight without enough ammo to get the job done.

We are proud of Match Director Deuce Stevens' fine finish at Winter Range this year. Deuce is the 2008 Traditional National Champion. He was also second overall.

Deuce is in the process of finishing the writing of the 10 stages for Range War. I am sure that our shooters will be pleased with Deuce's work. We will again be posting the stages on the website prior to Range War. We had some good feedback on this last year. Part of our philosophy is that posting the stages helps us to market our State Championship.

I would also like to let everyone know about our primary raffle item this year. This will be a pair of New Ruger Vaqueros in .38cal that are in the process of being engraved by Jim Downing. I am certain that the guns will look spectacular. As soon as we get the guns back from Jim Downing we will try to get a picture on the website. All members will have the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets for the guns regardless of whether they are able to make it to Range War or not.

Range War will also be a good opportunity for Wolverine Ranger members who have not completed the SASS RO I and RO II classes to do so. Cree Vicar Dave will be teaching RO I. The course will be free to Wolverine Rangers and \$10 for non-members. Dakota Doc and Lucky Lennie will be teaching RO II. The cost for the RO II course will be \$25. We are strongly recommending that all Wolverine Ranger members take both the RO I and RO II courses. Anyone operating a timer should be RO II certified. One of the new events for Range War this year will be the Ladies Tea Party on Friday from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm. Some of you may have heard, but I wish to announce that Lapeer will be holding .22 rimfire Silhouette Matches as part of our Long Range shooting on Saturdays before our regular Sunday matches. Hopefully we can get this started on June 21, 2008, if we can get everything "squared away" before that date. Those of you who would like to shoot might give me a call the week before the date and I can let you know if it's a "go" or "no go." In any event, if June doesn't work out we will certainly be ready for our next scheduled Long Range in August. 2008. In general we will have three age divisions: Adult (18 & over), Junior (13 thru 17), Buckaroo (12 & under: must have an adult on the firing line at all times). If you have a .22 rifle we will find a category for you to shoot. Single shots, lever actions, and semi-autos are all permitted as well as iron or optical sights. All shooting is offhand at distances of 25, 35, 40, & 50 yards. I know from personal experience that it's not quite as easy as it might look! Take care and we'll see ya in June.

The first ever long range seminar was held at our range at Ithaca on May 18. Twenty three men and women showed up to learn about what it takes to hit a target that is waaaaay out there. The weather could have been more cooperative, however, temps in the low 50's and a brisk northwest wind kept everybody on the firing line bundled up like it was November.

We sincerely hope that everyone who attended gained some useful tips to help them become better long range shooters. Remember that the cowboys are invited to come and shoot a match with us on June 14 to put to use what they learned. They will compete in their own class with other cowboys and win their own separate awards. This would be a great time to get some match experience in preparation for the August 9 Cowboy Silhouette Championship at Ithaca. Remember, somebody is going to win the 2008 Cowboy Silhouette Championship ... but it won't be you if you don't show up!

The 60 shot Black Powder Target Rifle Mid-Range State Championship was held at Cadillac, MI on May 24 and 25. The course of fire consisted of shooting at bulls-eye targets from prone cross sticks at 200, 300 and 600 yards. The weather was great with temps in the 70's and not even a hint of rain in the forecast. The gang from Ithaca consisted of the Lovely Miss Jodi, Smilin' Steve, Big Fella, Bad Brad, The Marshall and yours truly; El Guano. The conditions on Saturday were fishtailing headwinds at 5 to 15 miles per hour and switched 180 degrees overnight to fishtailing tailwinds from 10 to 20 mph on Sunday. All of the shooters were at their wits end trying to keep on top of the constantly switching wind direction and velocity. When all the shootin' was over and all the score tallyin' was done, El Guano wound up being the 2008 Black Powder Target Rifle Mid-Range State Champion with a score of 550-11x out of 600. In doing so he tied the 300 yd State record and set another State record for Match Aggregate.

For those single shot aficionados' who might want to know the load recipe it is as follows: rifle- 45-90 C. Sharps High Wall with 34" Badger Barrel, long range tang sights with Hadley Eye Cup and wind gauge spirit level front sight. Lyman 535 gr. Postell bullet cast at 30:1, Annealed Starline cases primed with Winchester Large Rifle Primers. 84 grains of Swiss F Powder loaded into a fire-formed case through a drop tube followed by a .030 Polywad and the bullet seated on the wad by hand, and using homemade bullet lube.

Don't forget about the 2008 Wolverine Ranger Cowboy Single Shot Rifle State Championship being held at the Detroit Sportsmens Congress on July 20th. This 45 shot match will feature stages fired from prone x-sticks, sitting or kneeling x-sticks, and offhand, all at 200 yards. START PRACTICING NOW! Match day is no time to get familiar with these shooting positions. When all the smoke clears we will know who the top 3 Cowboy Single Shot Shooters in the State are. You may shoot a lever gun but it MUST BE LOADED AND FIRED ONE ROUND AT A TIME. Black Powder or smokeless – your choice. Lead bullets only. By request from last years participants – Cowboy attire is optional.

International Blyth Trophy Postal Match

Sponsored by the Swadlingcote Rifle and Pistol Club in Derbyshire, England

The Wolverine Rangers have been invited to participate in this international postal match and Paul Behe has volunteered to be the Match Director for the State of Michigan.

Match Particulars:

- * 5 members per team
- * All firearms must be pistol caliber under lever (lever action) or single shot rifles.
- All iron sights and optical sights are allowed.
- Smokeless loads only. Black powder loads are not allowed.
- Shooting positions: standing, sitting, kneeling, or prone. Cross sticks are allowed.

Course of fire:

- * One NRA B-38 target at 100 yards ten
- Four NRA B-19 targets at 50 yards five rounds each.

This can be shot at any club that has the proper firing lines. All targets need to be shot in the month of June. Enter your best targets for your Official score. Re-Entry is Allowed. Targets will be scored by the NRA method; the edge of the bullet hole must touch a scoring ring to earn the higher score. Contact Batwing Betty at renee@darbyshire.net for score sheets. All team scores must be mailed to Paul Behe at 124 Huron, Mt. Clemens, MI 48043. Paul will email the final score sheets to England.

DSC Cowboys will make available the necessary ranges and will be shooting this on June 14th starting at high noon and after the main match on June 15th and on every Saturday for the month of June. The DSC Rifle range will be open on Monday nights from 5 till dusk. Rifle range fees are \$10.00 which includes targets. Extra targets will be available for \$1.00 each.


