Well, our 2008 Single Shot Mid-Long Range and Silhouette season has come to an end at last. This is the time of year that we start to plan our match schedule for 2009. As many of you probably know, there are some very popular Cowboy Long Range Gong Shoots held out west, most notable among these is the "Quigley Shoot" held in Montana.

It occurred to us that this type of shoot might appeal to the Cowboy Action shooters in Michigan who like the idea but don't want to saddle up and ride a couple of thousand miles to attend one.

Here's the deal. The A.P. Goodrich club has a 500 meter range to put on this type of shoot but the Board of Directors needs to know if there is any interest out there among the cowboys to go ahead and schedule a date. The match would consist of firing at full size buffalo, deer, prairie chickens, round gongs, etc. Black or smokeless your choice. Two main categories, big bore lever action rifle and big bore single shot rifle. Plain lead bullets only, no gas checks. Most shooting done from x-sticks. Some offhand shooting possible if I feel particularly ornery. Distances will range from 100 to 500 meters.
