SHOOTING TIPS FROM EL GUANO

Howdy pards,

Since all of you shoot offhand, I thought it might be a good idea before the season starts to go over some tips on good single shot shooting form.. Most of this stuff you've heard before, but you would be surprised at how many people THINK they are doing the right things to be a good offhand shot...but the holes all over the target prove otherwise. Now, don't get your undies all bunched up! Nobody was BORN a good shot. Paying attention to good form and quality practice at the range will work wonders for anybody.

OK. Here goes. First of all, RELAX. Nobody ever did well all wound up. The idea is to have fun and give it your best. Stand with your feet at about a 45 degree angle to the target. Raise your rifle and sight as steadily as you can at the target. Now close your eyes for a few seconds. When you open your eyes again, if the target is off to the right or left, SHIFT YOUR FEET to get back on target again. What you are doing is finding your "natural point of aim" without having to TWIST YOUR BODY to get back on target. Twisting your body starts to put stress on the muscles. This is something you don't need.

Grasp your rifle just enough to control it. NO DEATH GRIP! Some people lay their thumb on top of the grip. Others lay their thumb along side the grip next to their trigger finger. Too tight a grip on your trigger hand can induce uneven stresses that actually affect accuracy. The other hand supporting the forearm should be just ahead of the action, not out in the middle of the forearm. This position should bring your left elbow [for a right handed shooter] up into your body. Tuck it in there tight! This gives you "bone support" and is steadier than having your elbow just floating around out there. Mind you now, this style of shooting is for deliberate slow fire. If you are out hunting or in a timed match, you just don't have time to assume this very deliberate position. Your cheek should be on the same

part of the stock, with consistent pressure, for every shot. This is called your "cheek weld". It too, can affect accuracy.

If you have a Hadley eyecup on your rear Vernier sight, adjust the aperture bigger or smaller until the front sight aperture is as sharply in focus as you can get it. The front aperture "ring" should be about twice the diameter of the bullseye as it appears looking through the sights. In other words, you should have a "ring of light" around the bullseye. Too small of a front aperture makes it too hard to keep the bullseye in the front sight. The target should be centered in the front sight with a perfectly uniform ring of light around it.

Take a couple of deep breaths to oxygenate your blood. Bring the rifle up smoothly to your shoulder and snug it up in the same place and hold it there with the same amount of force for every shot. Begin sighting on your target. Set the trigger now if you have one...NOT BEFORE! If you get in the habit of setting the trigger before you bring the rifle up to your shoulder, I GUARANTEE one day you will have an accidental discharge when your trigger finger brushes the trigger. Then you'll feel stupid. Take a final breath and let part of it out. Focus on a perfect sight picture and SQUEEZE the trigger when the target is in the center of the front sight. Sounds easy, right? In fact, the timing of centering the target and squeezing the trigger when it is centered is the hardest thing to master in offhand shooting. It all lies in the practice of training your brain to respond instantly when that perfect sight picture appears. Believe me, NOBODY can hold a rifle steady. The good offhand shots have just learned when to squeeze the trigger. If you can't break the shot in under about 8 seconds, bring the rifle down and take a couple of deep breaths to re-oxygenate your blood. Look out at something in the distance to take the strain off your eyes. Re-focus on what you are about to do, bring the rifle up and start over. REMEMBER! That trigger is still set when you

are doing all of this so DON'T TOUCH IT!


You don't have to practice with your big bore rifle ALL the time. As a matter of fact, learning the shot timing can be done quite nicely with a .22 rifle. Scoped or iron sights makes no difference. And it's way cheaper too! And fun. When you practice, don't go easy on yourself. I mean it. Nobody got better that way. Use a three inch bullseye at 50 yards, a six inch bull at 100 yards, or a 12 inch bull at 200 yards. They are scaled to look the same size in the sights. If it isn't fairly hard to hit it isn't practice. No garbage can lids at 15 yards if you get my drift.

One last thing. PRACTICE! It's not like riding a bike where you learn once and you're good for life. You don't keep your edge unless you practice, practice, practice!
