We have had a long stretch of hot weather. Please be sure when you are shooting in 90 plus degree heat with high humidity that you stay hydrated and keep your electrolytes up. Most of us in this sport are not youngsters and the heat and humidity can put extra stress on our bodies. Please keep that in mind and remember that this is a game. If you see someone who may be suffering from heat exhaustion, do the right thing and intervene if necessary.

Korupt Karl and CC Top from Indiana will be putting on a CPL (concealed pistol license) class at the Gillary Farm in Columbiaville on Saturday September 17th. The original planned date was July 16th but we have been doing some major renovations to the farm house and The Lady wanted to have the farm house done before the Class. Everything will be completed by September 17th so we will be good to go. Please see the information and registration form on the Wolverine Rangers website at

www.wolverinerangers.org. The cost is \$100 per person payable to Edge Training Group and the class will run from 9:00 am until 5:00 pm. There are limited spaces available so if you are interested, I would recommend that you sign up early. Passage of the class will entitle you to go to your local police department in the state of Michigan to apply for a CPL. I would highly recommend that as many shooters as possible should get their CPL. For those of you who cannot make it on September 17th at our Farm, we will likely have another class in the spring. You can also check with your local gun club.

According to Cosmopolitan Christine (Secretary of the Wolverine Rangers), we are running slightly ahead of registrations for Range War compared to this time last year. We are hoping to get close to 300 shooters. This would make us one of the best attended SASS State Championships in the Midwest. Please send in your application if you have not already done so. We had a registration deadline of July 31st in order to get a free tee shirt or free Wolverine Rangers shooter bag. We will try to extend the deadline for a couple more days but we need to get the tee shirts ordered and shooter bags finalized so please don't wait any longer. Range War applications are available for downloading from our website.

As a reminder for Range War, we will be having a Cowboy Mini-Match and Wild Bunch Mini-Match on Friday morning from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Both Mini-Matches will run at the same time so you will not be able to shoot both. Side matches will take place on Friday. Long range events are from 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. and speed events are from 12:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.

We had the Wolverine Rangers Free Shoot / Annual Meeting at Fenton on Sunday July 10th hosted by the Butcher Butte Bunch. Big Bad Jim, Grubby Hardrock, Sassy Sue and everyone else from the Butcher Butte Bunch did a great job with the shoot



ROCKY RIVER REGULATORS

On June 5, 2011 the town of Rocky River welcomed 23 cowboys to the second Wild Bunch match for 2011. The cowboys shot 5 furious stages with multiple magazine changes and stoked the shotguns for maximum speed. When the dust settled the overall match winner and top Modern shooter was Moe Gunns. The top Traditional shooter was DSC's Beaver Creek Boy and our Open category winner was Poco Loco.

Father's Day was celebrated by 46 cowboy and cowgirls in the town of Rocky River. They all shot 6 stages under a bright blue Michigan sky. After every competitor had a chance to shoot the dreaded bottle rack, Faygo Kid was deemed the match overall winner. The top three DSC cowboys were J.J. Longley, Nine Finger Bob, and Fraser Fox.

July 17, 2011 brought the heat, both in air temperature and in competitive level. Under bright skies and 90+ degree heat the cowboys and cowgirls shot 6 stages. When the scores were tallied Faygo Kid walked away with top honors. Clint Chisum was the top Wrangler and the only clean match shooter. Top DSC honors went to J.J. Longley, Beaver Creek Boy, and Fraser Fox.

On Sunday, August 7, 2011 the D.S.C. Rocky River Regulators will be holding the third of 4 monthly Wild Bunch Matches for 2011. We will be shooting the SASS classes of Traditional and Modern (Men and Women) with a 1911 handgun, .45 colt rifles, and 1897 shotguns. In addition, we will have an Open class for all other firearms (used in CAS) so that ALL can come out and have fun. These Wild Bunch Matches will be 5 stages with multiple magazine changes for maximum excitement. A casual lunch will follow each match. Look to the Wolverine Rangers calendar for match times.

August 21, 2011 will be our second annual Cowboy T-shirt and shorts monthly match. The dress requirements are relaxed for the August heat so put on that Range War T-shirt, comfortable shorts, sneakers and come shoot the monthly match with us. Regular cowboy gear is always welcome.

Remember that we practice on most Saturdays from 10 AM until 2 PM and all the cowboys are happy to answer any of your questions about Cowboy Action Shooting and Wild Bunch.

★ SHOOTING TIPS ★

Howdy pards,

I think in this issue we'll talk about one of the big factors that must be dealt with if you want to shoot a lot of X's at your next mid/long range match. And that is...recoil management. I say management because recoil can NEVER be eliminated, but it CAN be dealt with. First of all, lets understand recoil. There is ACTUAL recoil which is measured in foot pounds. It's really a simple thing to understand. If you take a rifle of a given weight, and shoot a bullet of a given weight at a specified velocity, the rifle recoils backward with a certain amount of measurable force, expressed in foot pounds. Lets imagine two 45-70 rifles shooting the exact same load except one rifle weighs 7 pounds and the other weighs 12 pounds. The 7 lb. rifle will recoil more because it's lighter. Now let's take two 45-70 rifles of the same weight except one shoots a 300 grain bullet at 1200 feet per second and the other shoots a 530 grain bullet at the same velocity. The one shooting the heavier bullet at the same velocity will recoil more. Most of you understand this already since you use extremely light loads to reduce recoil in your cowboy matches. Lets get something straight right now. Since we are going to shoot mid/long range or silhouette, using lighter bullets or shooting at low velocity is NOT AN OPTION. Don't even think about it. BIG and FAST is the only way to go.

The other type of recoil we have to deal with is FELT recoil. This can be difficult because different people react differently to the exact same amount of recoil. Some people are "recoil sensitive" and others can shoot the exact same rifle and load and not be affected at all. Heavier people can soak up recoil better than skinnier ones [but not always]. That's no excuse to go out and pack on the pounds though.

- O.K. What exactly contributes to felt recoil and how can you deal with it?
- 1. I already mentioned rifle weight. If you are mainly going to compete with it and not lug it up and down mountains while hunting, get one that weighs a little under 12 lbs.[silhouette legal]. Heavy rifles help soak up recoil. If your rifle is a little on the light side, don't hesitate to drill a couple of ¾ inch holes under the butt plate and fill them with lead bird shot. If you do this, DON"T DRILL

THROUGH THE SIDE OF THE STOCK! It won't look good.

- 2. Pick the smallest caliber that is adequate for the job. 38-55 is the smallest caliber that will work for silhouette or mid-range although a .40 caliber is better for both. A 45-70 will do nicely for silhouette/mid-range and is minimum for long range. A 45-90 will do EVERYTHING well. Remember one thing though, the bigger the cartridge/bullet the more recoil you have.
- 3. Get a rifle with a shotgun buttstock because the large buttplate distributes the recoil over a larger area of your shoulder. This style of stock usually has a more rounded comb which won't bite your cheek when the rifle is fired. A "rifle" [curved] buttplate or a "military" buttplate are smaller and narrower and have sharper corners which concentrate recoil into a smaller area. This definitely increases felt recoil. Position the buttstock squarely on your shoulder muscle. If it is positioned near your collar bone, down toward your bicep muscle, or not firmly held against your shoulder, all I can say is OUCH! Guess how many black and blue arms and shoulders I've seen? A straight grip stock will work fine, but I've always had a preference for pistol gripped stocks. In my humble opinion, having a pistol grip makes the rifle easier to control. Almost all the competitors I know shoot from the prone X-stick position. Unfortunately, felt recoil is most evident when shooting this way since your body doesn't "give" when the rifle goes off. Remember though, this is the MOST ACCURATE position to shoot
- 4. Put a slip-on recoil pad on the rifle or wear a shoulder pad or both. Just be aware that using both will increase the length of pull of the stock and make correct sighting and "cheek weld" more difficult.
- 5. Use the best ear muffs you can buy. Their ability to suppress noise is called the NRR [noise reduction rating]. The higher the rating number, the better they are. Some shooters I know use foam ear plugs and shooting muffs. Why do I mention noise protection when we are talking about felt recoil? Here's why. The noise of the rifle going off and the recoil you feel are inseparably linked together. Believe it or not, if you reduce the NOISE of your rifle going off, your PERCEPTION of felt recoil will be less. It's true.

★ Shooting News ★

Shooting regularly will definitely acclimate you to the effects of recoil. Believe it or not, you actually start to get so used to it that you begin to ignore it. This allows you to concentrate 100% on the most important things, i.e. sight picture, breath hold and trigger squeeze. Lots of practice never hurt anybody!

Not being able to manage recoil is the number one cause of flinching, which dramatically affects how well you shoot. Remember, you can't eliminate recoil, but you CAN adapt to it and lessen its' effect on you.
