* Captain's Corner *

Howdy Pards,

It is late January as I am writing this Captain's Letter and we still have not had much snow yet. I am fine with that. Many of us are at this time wondering why we are still in the North whilst many of our pards are in warmer climates. Maybe it is because we like to experience all 4 seasons? Yeah, that's it!

Seriously, I actually like the winter. Seeing a blanket of snow on the ground and breathing the cool crisp air is invigorating. I can do without the ice and snow on the roads but there is a tranquility to a nice winter day.

Now down to some business. I was in Vegas for the Territorial Governor's Summit in December and was present for all of the TG meetings. I had to leave early on Saturday to catch my plane home and did not get the official results before I left. The only agenda item that passed was item #1 which states that any shooter who does not finish 2 or more stages is not eligible for an award. I had mixed feelings about that one because the only circumstances which I had experience with was when a shooter (such as Split Rail down at GOA a couple of years ago) was not able to finish due to health reasons. My feeling was that if he could still beat some shooters who shot all of he stages then more power to him. I could see the other side, however, which was basically that in any other sporting event the competitors are required to complete the event in order to be considered for an award.

The one issue which did get somewhat heated, in large part from me, was item #5 which had a set of category rules. One of the rules would allow the match directors to set a minimum number (10 was being discussed) for large matches before the match director would be required to offer the category. There was some pretty vocal opposition on that from many of the women and from some of the men whose wives shot in unpopular categories. As you all probably know, The Lady shoots Classic Cowgirl. I don't think that there have ever been 10 shooters in that category in any match including the National Championships. Classic Cowgirl is a difficult category to shoot because the women have to shoot duelist and shoot at least .40 caliber in their rifle and pistols and shoot either a hammered double or an 1887 lever action shotgun. The Lady shoots that category because she likes it and wants to shoot it. She has not shot any other category in about the last 8 years or so. I believe that it is unfair for the match director in a major match not to offer the official SASS categories. If this was a track meet and a competitor trained for the mile run, the match director would not tell the competitor that he or she had to run the 100 because there were not enough competitors in the mile run to have a good show.

The other point was that such a rule would disproportionately affect the women shooters. The powers that be were losing track of the most important rule of Cowboy Action Shooting – **DON'T PISS OFF THE WOMEN.** I would say that I believe I may have had an influence in keeping the Classic Cowgirl category available at Winter Range for this year. 'Nuff said on that.

Cosmopolitan Christine is in the process of putting the 2012 Calendar together. If you are a club representative and you have not sent in your shooting schedule for this year please do so ASAP so that we can get the Calendar done.

That is about it for now. Please don't forget to give your kids a hug and a kiss and tell them that you love them.

ROCKY RIVER REGULATORS

The town of Rocky River sits idle during January and February with only a few hearty cowboys that venture out for some practice on Saturday mornings from 10 AM until noon.

On the third Saturday in February, the cowboys will conduct their monthly committee meeting followed by cowboy skeet with our coach guns. We will see if our skills match up to the fast moving clay pigeon.

For 2012 we have 10 monthly matches scheduled on the 3rd Sunday from March through December.

This year the DSC cowboys have added two new matches to their calendar of events.

First, on March10, 2012 there will be a twilight match with regular cowboy guns. The match will be a three stage cowboy match starting about an hour before sunset (see WR schedule for time) and continuing into darkness. The steel targets will be painted white and illuminated with candles. This should be challenging and fun.

Next, on June 24, 2012 at 9 AM the DSC cowboys will host a military service rifle match utilizing bolt action rifles from any country. This match will be shot from 25 to 40 yards at steel and shoot through targets. matches using iron sight cowboy rifles during the 2012 shooting season. These matches are shot with larger than normal targets because we are not using optical sights. Calibers are .22 rim fire and center fire pistol calibers. The match will be fired from 25 to 50 yards at chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams. We have classes for everyone so if you only have a rifle with a scope we will not turn you away.


Rim fire shooter will not be forgotten. We will have a cowboy match using rim fire hand guns and rifles. The targets for these matches are made of lighter steel so a light bullet impact can be scored. We might even have a category for .22 automatics with a magazine change for fun.

And lastly, the wild bunch matches will continue for 2012. To shoot this match you will need a 1911 handgun in 45 ACP, a 1897 pump shotgun and a lever action rifle 40 caliber or larger. If you don't have all of these firearms, bring what you have and shoot in our open category and have some fun. Just like in regular cowboy matches the steel targets are shot from 7 to 15 yards but instead of using two handguns multiple magazine changes are made in the 1911 and the shotgun is loaded before the timer starts.

See you in March for the first match.




