### Reloading Tips

by Attica Jack

I don't claim to be an expert on reloading ammo, but here are some tips I use to keep things running smoothly at the loading table and on the shooting stages. I always clean the primer pockets on the cases that are going to be reloaded. The first thing that I do with fired brass is to decap them with a Lyman universal decapping die. This die decaps all calibers, just use the appropriate shell holder for your press. Then, use a primer pocket cleaning tool, (not the wire brush type) and clean the primer pockets. Place the cleaned brass into a container and shake them vigorously before putting them into the cleaning vibrator filled with walnut media. You will be surprised at how much carbon and primer residue will be in the bottom of the container when you pour the brass into the case vibrator. I let the vibrator run for about an hour. Since I like shiny brass, I change the media, to corn cob with a polishing agent added, and run for another hour. The brass will be clean, shiny and ready to be loaded. I have talked to other reloaders who say that they never clean the primer pockets. Are they just lucky?

We have all been at the loading table where a cowboy/cowgirl is loading their revolvers and the cylinder cannot rotate, because of a high primer. The worst case scenario being when shooting the stage and the revolver locks up because of a high primer and that stage will be scored with several misses. I try to keep Murphy's Law at bay and clean the primer pockets. A correctly seated primer should be flush or slightly below flush with the case. A dirty primer pocket, besides jamming up the cylinder can also cause a soft firing pin hit on the primer. The carbon and primer residue will cushion the firing pin strike and you could get a misfire. Clean those primer pockets. CAUTION!!!!!!!!!!!!!! Do not try to reseal a high primer in loaded ammo...bad things will happen!

One more thing; I always wear rubber surgical gloves when reloading, keeping the direct skin to lead contact to a minimum. You can buy gloves at Harbor Freight tools. That is all.

Shoot Straight, Shoot Safe.


