came to the range to test their skills with a 5 stage Wild Bunch match. When the scores were tabulated the overall winner in the Modern class was Kentucky Drifter. Shooting in the other SASS recognized classes using "big" bullets, DSC's Nine Finger Bob won the SASS men's Traditional division. Buslin' Belle was the SASS Women's Modern winner and Onyx won the "Open" division using and holstering 4 vaqueros on each stage.

October 20th was a perfect fall day in Michigan. With the clear and sunny skies, thirty four cowboys and cowgirls tested their cowboy action skills against 5 furious stages. The Shooter's Stance

My First Shoot

Yes, it's true, I almost chickened out.

It was the night before October 26th, and the last shootout in Plymouth for the Wolverine Rangers Cowboy Action Shooting club was the very next day. My good friends Longshot Lillian and Outrider Outlaw had invited me to actually shoot an entire match, myself. I only held a gun for the first time earlier this summer. I surprised myself by saying yes. Longshot is good at everything she puts her hand to, and I'm still rebuilding my life after a painful divorce a few years ago, so I thought "hey, if Longshot thinks I have the guts and gusto to go through with it then maybe I can do this. Maybe I just will".

After working a 16 hour shift on the 25th, I was only awake fretting for a little while before the anxiety of backing out overrode the anxiety of going through with it.

At the range the next day, I was simply amazed at the sheer kindness and camaraderie of everyone there. It was a cold, blustery day and I was loaned an extra jacket, hot packs and gloves. I shot with the ammunition and guns supplied by Andy Horshurodinon, an amazing veteran of Cowboy Action Shooting and my mentor for the match. Panhead Pete patiently gave me guidance at the start of each stage and Andy was right at my side during each shot, eyeing my technique (or lack of it!) and giving expert, on-target advice.

I didn't do all that well at the first stage, but I took in a lot of feedback and gained some confidence from just getting through it. Longshot was very encouraging, she kept me focused on what I was doing well and that lifted my spirits. I didn't worry about timing and I kept the right order, but the real progress was made as I steadily improved at hitting the targets and sharpened my skill with the shotgun that had left me with the first impression of, "No Way!" I even had one clean stage and was well congratulated.

The whole day, from hanging with a great posse to the opportunity and first blush of success at shooting, was a tremendous confidence builder. There's something about being a woman and being able to at least think to yourself that "yeah, if I had to, I could wield a weapon in self defense, or shoot a deer if I had to bring home supper". Primal, maybe, but it does bring a sense of satisfaction along with the realization that every new thing gained is progress on the road to creating a better, stronger self.
