I would also like to welcome our new Marketing Director Sixgun Scotsman to the Board and to thank Scotsman for agreeing to take on this position. It has been vacant for a while and it is an important position.

The Lady and I along with Deuce attended the SASS Convention in Branson, Missouri in December. They had an unusual snow storm which dropped about 6 inches of snow while we were there. No problem for us but some of the Southerners had some issues driving in the snow. There are some benefits of being from the North.

The results of the Territorial Governors' Summit are as follows:

Agenda Item # 1 - Passed with a language adjustment. This new rule essentially provides that if the action of a long gun which was open and empty closes in the process of or after it is put down, it is a "no call".

Agenda Item # 2 - Did not pass. This proposed rule would have eliminated the minor safety penalty for safely picking up a dropped round. Agenda Item # 3 – Passed. This allows modifying a curved trigger on a rifle to a straight trigger. The intent is to make it less likely for a shooter to pinch his or her finger in cycling a rifle. Ouch! Been there, done that.

Agenda Item # 4 – Passed. This removes the Bisley hammer/grip frame restrictions and essentially allows a Bisley grip with a Ruger Vaquero type hammer.

That is all that I have for now. Stay warm while we all look forward to the warmer weather and for shooting season to begin.

Thanks again to all of our members who are veterans of our armed forces who have sacrificed to make this the greatest country in the history of the world. Please remember that freedom is not free.

In closing, please be sure to give your kids and grandkids a hug and a kiss and tell them that you love them every day.
