# ★ Shooting News ★

## Rocky River Regulators of DSC (Utica)

June 1, 2014 was our second Wild Bunch match of the season. Coyote Claxton wrote 5 Wild Bunch stages that included close and far pistol targets and multiple magazine changes. One scenario even included a farmyard full of animal targets.

Once the 1911's were holstered DSC's J.J. Longley shot clean and won the match shooting in the SASS Modern class. The SASS Traditional class, shooting his traditional 1911 one handed was won by Tres Hombres. DSC's Camptown finished second in the SASS Modern class and he also shot a clean match.

We do have the SASS sanctioned Wild Bunch classes recognized but if you don't have all the Wild Bunch gear, no problem. We have an open class where you can shoot any caliber CAS lever action rifle and any CAS shotgun you may own. All you need is ANY semi automatic pistol that shoots LEAD bullets and you are ready for a Wild Bunch experience.

A typical wild bunch stage could be 20 pistol, 10 rifle, and 6 shotgun. So if you want plenty of shooting and action, this might just be "your cup of tea".

Our next Cowboy match was on Father's Day, Sunday, June 15<sup>th</sup>. Forty-eight cowboys and cowgirls came out to shoot and shoot they did. After all the shots were down range and most of them hit targets; Faygo Kid was declared the winner followed closely by Colt McCloud and J.J. Longley.

The Father's day shoot always brings the targets in closer and the cowboy action shooters took full advantage of very hittable targets. Shooting clean matches were Andy Horsurodinon, Attica Jack, Big Bad Jim, Briscoe Callahan, Broke N' West, Cactus Kay, Little River Kid, Mike Fink, Mr. Beer Belly Willie, Old Doc Potter, Poco Loco, and DSC shooter's John Weston, Nine Finger Bob, Rifle Rick, The Apostle, and J.J. Longley.

July 20<sup>th</sup> was a beautiful Michigan Sunday to play cowboy and/or cowgirl and 36 cowboy action shooters had the same idea. Beemer portrayed The Lone Ranger from 1941 - 1954 and lived in Oxford from 1942 to 1965, when he passed away.

Your items will be mailed to you after the shoot.

# ★ Epitaph Survey ★

Late last year, a survey was posted for Wolverine Rangers. Various questions were asked. The results of one of the questions will be posted here with each issue.

## Survey Question:

How did you become involved in Cowboy Action Shooting?

Visited an ex-neighbor and friend out in Colorado in '99. Took me to his local range. Started reading the SASS Chronicle. — Broke N West

Had a friend that lived in Durango CO. that tried for 10 yrs to get into CAS. I just kept telling him I was to busy playing Indian. So, I was reading a little more about in in Mags and Moe and I were shooting varmit rifles and going to shoot prairie dogs once and so I decided to try it out. Moe and The Clan have never looked back . — Faygo Kid

My brother-in-law is a camera man for a tv station that did a local report about the cowboy action shooting at the Rockford Sportsmans Club. He was working with Jerry Barnaby (reporter). After they aired the video, Don, my brother-in-law made me a copy of the video. He knew I enjoyed shooting. Tessa Two Gunner and I watched the video and within a few weeks we attended our first CAS match at the Rockford gun club. Sunvale Pete was there and graciously offered to let Tessa Two Gunner and me try shooting a stage with his guns. We thought it would be a fun activity that the two of us could enjoy and after a few weeks of mulling it over we decided to collect the equipment that we would need to get going. In January of '07 we shot our first match at RSC and we have been hooked every since. — Ketchum Quick

I saw an article in Guns and Ammo in 1982 and thought it would be fun but would never come to Michigan. Later, a friend found out that the Paw Paw Conservation Club was hosting CAS shoots so we went out to take a look and the rest is history. I went because it looked like fun but have stayed because of the great people I have met. — Cayuse Jack

Went to woods and waters and talked to a cowboy shooter i had always loved the old west and the cowboy way since i was a young boy as an adult i had rode bulls in a small rodeo circuit and loved shooting single actions so we went and watched a match and within a month iwas shooting in a match. — Wolf Creek Tom

I was on active duty with the Navy, stationed in Long Beach, CA. A friend on the ship asked me if I wanted to go to a shooting match. We went over to a civilian's house and then to the range with him. I was lugging a hernia bag full of camera gear, intending just to take pictures. When we got to the range, while I was looking around trying to find the best places to shoot (pictures) from, a young lady came up to me with a clipboard and asked my name. I told her and asked what she needed it for. When she told me it was for the shooters' list, I told her I was just there to take pictures. At that time the civilian we had ridden out to the range with came up and told me that my range fees had been paid, there were guns and gear for me to use and that this was not a spectator sport. I was going to shoot, end of story, end of subject, end of conversation. That was on the first Saturday of October, 1984 and I've been at it ever since. — Andy Horshurodinon

16 years ago cowboy shooting came to Lapeer County Sportsmen's Club, even though I was interested in cowboy shooting, it took me six years to get off my duff to go see what it was all about. So one Sunday winter shoot I went to the club to get more info and watch. Wow!!!! I did not expect what happened.
