## Rocky River Regulators of DSC (Utica)

The town of Rocky River has finally started to show some life. The snow is melted and now we see our town boardwalks and are looking forward to the 2015 Cowboy Action shooting season.

Our first monthly Cowboy Action match was delayed a few weeks but we did let the lead fly on Sunday, March 29, 2015. The day was crisp and cold but the sun was bright and warmed us just a little. Twenty-one hearty cowboys came out to dust the cobwebs out of their shooting irons. When the shooting was done and the scores were calculated D.S.C.s J.J. Longley was declared the overall winner. Faygo Kid and Moe Gunns followed J.J. closely in the final standing. Shooting clean matches were Rodent and the following Cowboys from D.S.C.: Camptown, Careless Carl, John Weston, Terrebonne Bud, and The Apostle.

April is going to be a busy month at Rocky River with some shooting events...

On Sunday, April 12, 2015 we are holding a Bolt Action Military Rifle Match. This is a different type of match than Cowboy Action, but growing in popularity with lots of shooters. On Sunday, April 19, 2015 we will have our first Wild Bunch match of the year. This is generally the day we have our cowboy match but we have delayed the regular cowboy match one-week due to personal calendar conflicts. So plan to come out and shoot the Wild Bunch match with us. We will shoot 4 or 5

Wild Bunch stages (depending on range conditions) followed by a light lunch and invite all to come out and try this shooting sport.

We do have the SASS sanctioned Wild Bunch classes recognized but if you don't have all the Wild Bunch gear, no problem. We have an open class where you can shoot any caliber CAS lever action rifle and any CAS shotgun you may own. All you need is ANY semi automatic pistol that shoots LEAD bullets and you are ready for a Wild Bunch experience. A typical wild bunch stage could be 20 pistol, 10 rifle, and 6 shotgun. So if you want plenty of shooting and action, this might just be "your cup of tea".

On Saturday, April 25, 2015 at noon, we are hosting a Silhouette Match on our 50-yard range. We shoot everything from .22 rifles to our Cowboy lever action rifles. Come and join us, we will have a class for almost any firearm that you bring. Need more information, call Terrebonne Bud (Jim Estes) at 248-709-5254.

On Sunday, April 26, 2015, one week later than normal, we will have our regular monthly Cowboy Action match. Registration starts at 8:30 AM followed by the safety meeting at 9:30 AM and then 5 fast and furious stages.

So no excuses please, there are plenty of shooting opportunities at D.S.C. during the month of April, come out and join us.

For Cowboy Action Shooting, they will have the opportunity to shoot pistols and rifles in 4 calibers (.22, .38, .44spl and 45colt) plus shotguns in .410, 20 & 12 gauge.

This is a very popular event which brings back the ladies to this event as well as to our monthly CAS practices.

## The Shooter's Stance

### X-Ring Rubber Bullets

With the long, cold and snowy Michigan winter upon us, I try to go to an indoor range once a month and shoot my 1911.

Dry firing my Vaqueros at a couple of paper targets hanging on the basement wall was getting really boring. I started searching the internet and found a couple of options.

The first was homemade wax bullets, powered by only the primer. It looked too messy for me. The second was rubber bullets, also powered by the primer. You-tube videos showed X-Ring rubber bullets to be accurate to 25 feet, re-usable, chronographed at 400 fps, and easy to use.

I ordered one package of 50 X-Ring bullets in 44 caliber from Meister Bullets for about \$15.00 delivered.

The first thing you have to do is resize the brass and drill out the flash holes to 1/8<sup>th</sup> on large primer brass, and mark that brass for rubber bullets only. I used red magic marker. The rubber bullets are pushed into the brass by light finger pressure, not quite flush, then seat the primer and you're done.

My rubber bullet backstop was a piece of cardboard and a blanket hanging behind that. Undamaged bullets can be cleaned and reused up to 30 times. I shot 10 rubber bullets in my basement, using my 4 5/8 Vaquero, at a distance of 20 feet, unsupported, duelist style.

With no recoil, they printed 4" low. I obtained a 2 1/2 inch, 5 shot, one handed, unsupported group. I won't shoot them in the basement again. It was quite smoky and set off the smoke detector. Plus, there is the lead factor.

The brass was very dirty and the gun was dirty from only 10 shots. Two swipes with a bore snake cleaned the cylinder and bore, and a toothbrush and solvent cleaned the rest of the gun.

I can't wait to shoot them again, in the garage this time. Just another option for dry firing.
