Johnson Creek Regulators - Plymouth

On May 20, 1862 Abraham Lincoln signed the Homestead Act of 1862. The Homestead Act opened up over 270 million acres of land to settlement, most of it west of the Mississippi River leading to the settlement of the American west.155 years later, 28 Cowboys, including new shooters James Vernon Sr. and Austin the Outlaw settled onto the lands of the Johnson Creek Regulators.

Three Deuce Tom referred to carnage that followed as our "Match of Sweeps." Several sweeps not previously seen at Johnson Creek were introduced. They included a Chimney Sweep (a vertical sweep), Texas Sweep (dumps on single targets with all four guns) and a 2017 Sweep (2 on #1, 0 on #2, 1 on #3 and 7 on #4).

Before the match got underway, A JCR member donated a free match. Winner of that free match appropriately was Buckaroo JC Wade. Honest Abe took the 50-50 drawing.

The Sinola Kid navigated the Match of Sweeps the quickest with a raw time of 120.52 and an adjusted time of 140.52. Clean matches were turned in by Attica Jack, Sarge and Henry Moonshine. Longshot Lillian was the top lady shooter and JC Wade was top Buckaroo. Spartan Johnny had the fastest single stage time of the day with a 16.97 on the Texas Sweep stage.

Monthly Match

What is a monthly match? For most of us you decide what club/match you want to shoot at. On the day of the match, you put on your cowboy duds, load up the car or truck, hoping you didn't forget anything and drive to the match. Upon arriving at the match you sign up, pay your shooting fees, shoot the stages and sometimes complain about a stage, eat lunch, listen to the scores, load up your vehicle, drive home and you are done.

I don't think a lot of the shooters realize how much thought and work goes into setting up a monthly match. First, someone has to design the stages. The stages have to be safe, fun, different, easy to shoot, but not too easy or too confusing either.

Now the hard work comes. I am guessing at a

normal 5 stage match, the people setting up move about 2000 lbs. of steel and then after a match the steel must be taken down and stored.

Finally, someone had to plan the lunches - not an easy task. Are we having 15 shooters or 40?

If anyone thinks planning a match is easy, write out a stage, set up the stage, and take it back down. Volunteers are always welcome for set up and take down.

Not complaining, just explaining. I would like to tip my hat to all that plan and set up and feed us at the monthly matches.
