boy finds his way to the last round up. Wally lived his life as a resident of Oxford, Michigan and graduated from Oxford High School in 1959. He attended Oakland University where he earned his Bachelor's Degree, and then at-



tended Michigan State University to get his Master's Degree. Wally taught American History and Civics at Lake Orion Schools. He coached baseball and football for the school system, which earned him a place in the Michigan High School Hall of Fame in both sports. He was an active member of the North-South Skirmish Association. He also started the Cowboy shooting program at Lapeer County Sportsmen's Club. Wally was also one of the original life members that organized the Wolverine Rangers and was Territorial Governor for SASS. Our prayers go out to his family. He will be missed.
