Rocky River Regulators of DSC (Utica)

The 2019 Wolverine Ranger's Range War is in the books and Deuce Stevens set the match to be fast and furious and it lived up to its billing. Congratulations to all the Michigan State Category Champions and a special salute to our Michigan State Champions K.J. Stevens and Deuce Stevens.

D.S.C. had five cowboys compete at Range War and we had a blast. Jack Holladay was 3rd in Senior Frontier Cartridge (and a clean match), J.J. Longley was 7th in Elder Statesman, Camptown was 5th in Senior, Coyote Claxton was 7th in Cattle Baron, and John Weston was 9th in Silver Senior.

Saturday, September 7th was our 3rd and final Wild Bunch match for 2019. Sixteen competitors came out and shot 5 fast and furious stages of Wild Bunch action. When the dust settled and the scores were posted Camptown was first in the SASS Men's Modern division and Attica Jack was first in the SASS Traditional division. Shooting the only clean match was Tres Hombre.

September in Michigan was supposed to be cooler but on match day at DSC it was muggy and threatening rain. Hot is the way to describe the shooting action as twenty-two cowboys and cowgirls competed for top honors at this match. Finishing first overall was Leadfoot Luke as he edged out J.J. Longley and Camptown. Shooting clean matches were Attica Jack, Clint Chisum, Cody Wales, John Weston, Longshot Lillian, and Rochester Kid. It was nice to welcome back two of our Canadian cowboys, Clint Chisum and Cody Wales. Not only was it fun to shoot with them once again but also they added an "international" flare to our monthly match.

The Shooter's Stance

Content Is King

Howdy, my name is Jeff, and I volunteered to take over as the Wolverine Rangers webpage manager, but my SASS handle is The Lost Egg, literally and figuratively. Some of you may have noticed I've made several pitches for more pictures and videos to post on our web page. By the time you read this, hopefully some of the pictures and possibly even a couple videos from Range War 2019 will be live. My goal here is to explain a little of the why, and hopefully convince you to join in the digital fun.

Although I'm a Mechanical Engineer by education, I currently work as a Product Manager (PM) for engineering software used in design & manufacturing. Part of being a PM is working with marketing and figuring how to get the word out about your product.

About a decade ago, some of that meant having a web page, with landing pages that were optimized for particular keywords. I taught myself how to do the web page optimization, and as test I made a webpage for the martialarts school I taught some lessons at, and managed to get it on page one of Google ranking. For those that don't know, page one is the goal, and you hide your dead bodies on pages three and up.

The problem is people have no problem finding the Wolverine Rangers webpage, and there really is no other CAS competition in Michigan we have to rank higher than. The real competition is the opportunity cost of whatever people are giving up to shoot at a CAS match. Today, marketing a brand, activity, or piquing someone's interest in something usually involves social media, and the single most important way of promoting something on social media is content. Content is king! Content usually means articles, images, and videos.

Back in 2015, my then employer wanted to expand the social media marketing, so I had to dig into it. Our mission was called "Area 51", where we were tasked with having our software's engagement be at least 51% of the total engagement for our market, or put another way, our engagement needed to be more than all the competitors combined. Engagement in this case is a like, a share or if someone leaves a comment.

Currently the three most popular social media platforms are, in order, Youtube, Facebook, and Instagram. Right now, Youtube has about 1.3 billion of uploads per year. That's about 563 hours of content uploaded, every minute. If you are a Facebook user, you may have noticed they are pushing more and more videos.

Content is King! If you want someone to notice your activity/club/sport, first you have to have some content about it. The more interesting the content the better. If each club submitted one video per year, CAS related, that would be a good number of videos. Not only would they help the Wolverine Rangers, it would help all of the clubs in a small way. Some pictures from each meet, and maybe a video go a long way to getting things noticed.

While there are literally dozens if not hundreds of firearm related youtube channels, there are not many that specialize in CAS. Same with Instagram. If we have a shared goal of expanding our sport, it starts with content, and content starts with anyone interested.
