Range War 2021 will be held at Bluewater Sportsman's Association in Kimball, MI on Sept. $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$, 2021.

There are no restrictions this year for the number of entries, we will be fully open to all those that register. We have secured the Alexander's banquet facility again and will have our indoor Sunday night banquet and awards as we have done in the past.

We have posted our Canadian invitation letter for those that are able to cross the border and shoot with us this year. We greatly missed our Canadian contingent last year and hope that they will return to shoot with us again. Johnson Creek Regulators - Plymouth

On May 22nd, 1868, the Great Train Robbery took place near Marshfield, Ind., as seven members of the Reno gang absconded with \$96,000 in cash, gold and bonds. In todays' dollar that would be equivalent to \$1.8 Million!! Quite a haul!

On May 22nd 2021, 43 shooters gathered in Plymouth Michigan to relive those days of the Old West, albeit the looney Blazing Saddles version! Not Dead Ed wrote the stages and acted as match director. Many compliments to Ed, for writing great stages with the Blazing Saddles movie as the theme.

The festivities began with a Swap meet during sign in which throughout the day! Many goods were traded and sold.

Our monthly **free** side match was a 5 target double tap with rifle! Three Deuce Tom was fastest and most accurate and won a free match!

Cowboys Had Ter- Bank Robberies rible Hygiene

Although actors appear clean and wellshaven in Western films, the reality was much dirtier. According to True West Magazine, most cowboys were not able to bathe for weeks at a time. This left them susceptible to multiple illnesses and parasites.

Clean water was difficult to come by, as was soap. Settlers made soap from animal fats, and it often irritated the skin. Dentists did not exist; people had to turn to barbers to get their teeth extracted. Native Americans were far cleaner than the average cowboy.

Were Very, Very Rare

Bank robberies are one of the most popular plot devices for Western movies. But how many bank robberies actually happened in the Wild West? According to Larry Schweikart at the Foundation for Economic Freedom, not many. Only eight bank robberies occurred between 1859 1900.

Banks in the 1800s were heavily secured, says the Wild World of History. Banks usually adjoined other buildings, and large iron balls sat on top of safes. The shape of the ball caused an explosive effect when people shot at it. Those who tried to rob banks had a difficult time.
