This year's Free Membership Shoot is a bit earlier than usual. It will be held at Lapeer County Sportsman's Club on Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup>. We will meet in the clubhouse for lunch, awards, and the Wolverine Rangers Annual Membership meeting. We will review plans for Range War and this year's Michigan State Wild Bunch Action Shooting Championship "Shootout at Bloody Porch". There will be giveaways like previous years: one entry to Gunsmoke, one entry to Range War, one entry to Shootout at Bloody Porch, Starline Brass, etc. So, join us for a fun day of shooting, see what's happening with the Wolverine Rangers and possibly end up with a nice prize.

#### Shootout at Bloody Porch:

This year we will have a Michigan State Wild Bunch Championship. The shoot is named after the famed shootout in which Pike Bishop and his bunch massacre General Mapache's troops, and die with their guns blazing. We will hold this year's shoot at Saginaw Field and Stream Club on Saturday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>. This will be an eight stage one day match. We will shoot four stages, break for a light lunch, and then shoot the last four stages. Awards presentation and dinner to follow in the clubhouse.

The eight-stage format is the way most of our surrounding states hold their WBAS championships. This year our Match Director will be Ethan Callahan, with myself as the Range Master. While eight stages is a lot of shooting in one day, we plan to have some fun scenarios, and if you've ever shot at Saginaw you know the targets will be big and close. All SASS approved categories shall be recognized.

Applications are posted on our website. More information will be posted soon. We have set up the page to be a similar layout to the Range War page. Look for the "Wild Bunch" tab on the home page.

Eleven competitors came out for the 2022 inaugural match at Fenton and from the comments that were heard they all had a good time.

We decided to make this first match a combination of tried and true sweeps and a couple new sweeps that made a person have to think about it. We shot six stages. One of them was an all shotgun stage. It seemed to be pretty well received by all who were there.

Unfortunately, it looked like we should have changed the name of the place to Butcher Butte shootin' gallery and mud wrestling arena. There was quite a bit of mud in the shooting bays and on the path from one bay to another. As a convenience to all concerned we shot all six stages in only two bays. That way travel from stage to stage was minimized.

We did have one casualty during the match. One of the knockdown shotgun targets took a lethal hit and broke into two parts. It will be undergoing restorative surgery soon and should be back to work in May.

# Sugar's Corner



## Wyoming Cowboy Cookies

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup sweetened shredded coconut
- 3/4 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1-1/2 cups packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs, room temperature
- 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 cups old-fashioned oats
- 2 cups (12 ounces) chocolate chips

#### Directions

Place coconut and pecans on a 15x10x1-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° for 6 to 8 minutes or until toasted, stirring every 2 minutes. Set aside to cool.

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla; beat well. Combine the flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Add to creamed mixture; beat well. Stir in the oats, chocolate chips, toasted coconut and pecans.

Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls (size 40 scoop) onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 350° about 10-12 minutes or until browned. Remove to wire racks to cool.

Take care not to overbake: You want them to be crunchy on the outside and a bit chewy on the inside.
