#### Range War:

This year is the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Range War, 1999-2023. Plans are well underway, and the applications are on the website for mail in and online entries. As usual at this time of year the applications are trickling in. We have a few updates and new items this year as we plan to have a blast for the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

First, we are having a stage writing contest. We are inviting everyone to submit their favorite stage for consideration in this year's match. This can be a stage you love, one that you enjoyed at a previous Range War, or just one that you thought up that you would like to shoot. These can be submitted via email, mail, text or in person to Sinola Kid. Entries will be accepted now thru June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Our range committee will review all entries and select ten stages for the 2023 Range War. Each selected entry will be published in our shooter's handbook as the stage writer and receive a special 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary award from the Wolverine Rangers. Let's all dig deep and find some real gems to enter.

Second, we are looking for stage sponsors for this year's match. Each stage sponsor will receive advertising/recognition space in the shooter's handbook as well as signage on the stage. Sponsorships will start at a recommended donation of \$100 per stage. We will use these funds to update our props, tables, and feel of the stages. Of course, we are open to suggestions as

well for improvements. If you are interested in sponsoring a stage this year, please contact me to discuss by July 1<sup>st</sup>, as we need time to get the book updated.

Third, our awards banquet will again be at Alexanders banquet facility. We are working on buckles and new side match awards this year with a 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary logo. We are trying to make them standout and be something special, so having a count earlier than normal will help. Please sign up early so we can plan our numbers efficiently. We will be trying a new table and seating plan to reduce the need for people to wait in line at the banquet facility to get in. At registration we will have a table chart that you will be able to put your name down at the table of your choice, with whomever you wish to sit with. Then this will be at the banquet facility, details still underway, and you will be able to walk in and know where you will be sitting.

Fifth, we have finalized the contract for golf cart rentals. Information and sign up for these will be posted soon on our website. There will be an electronic application, like our shooter registration that you will be able to sign up and pay the fees for the carts and receive an email confirmation.

Sixth, we are working on a fun event in the clubhouse on Saturday evening after the trap event. More info coming soon. But it is old west themed and should be a fun time for all.

Seventh, unfortunately you will see that we had to increase the camping fee this year by five dollars. The township that Bluewater Sportsman's Club (BWSC) resides in noticed our campground for the first time in 24 years last year. They have informed BWSC and the Rangers that we have not filed for a camping permit, as is a requirement of a camping area of this size. We need to apply for and pay the permit fee and add additional steps to prove that we are complying with the township's requirements. Hence the additional \$5.

Lastly, as with every shoot, we cannot put these events on without our volunteers. Without the hard work from everyone we cannot be successful. We have a great team of volunteers and I urge anyone that can to offer to help. Spreading the work out makes a better shoot for all involved. Please let me know if you are able to help. This can be anything from set up day, tear down, side matches, registration, or months in advance for other tasks, there are plenty to go around.

News from The Johnson Creek Regulators......


Howdy All,

#### Eagleville Cowboys - Central Lake


#### A Major Change....

#### The Shooter's Stance



#### Homemade 12 ga. Practice Rounds

I wanted to make some 12 ga. dummy rounds to practice loading my 870 Remington I use in 3 gun. I went on the internet and got some ideas. Here's what I have come up with. First you will need a shot shell reloader, six empty 12 ga. shells, a different colored shell from what color you normally use is nice, but not necessary, some shot/bb's, 8 cardboard wads, 1/2" punch to make the wads from the cardboard from a 12 pack of beer, hot glue gun, a razor or sharp knife and a magic marker.

First resize the empty shell and punch out the primer, take the 1/2" punch and punch out 48 cardboard wads. You will stack these wads to replace the powder charge, for my shells I used 8 cardboard wads. Now press in the plastic shot wad, I used CB0178 7/8 oz. wad. Press in the shot wad, you might have to add or subtract some cardboard wads to get the correct length of the shot wad for a good crimp. Drop the shot and crimp, there should be no rattling of bb's/shot, if there is, add a couple of cardboard wads. Using the hot glue gun, fill the primer pocket, when hard, cut off excess glue flush with the brass, mark the shell with magic marker, and that is it.
