Heat 101



Know the Difference Between Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke

Heat Exhaustion

Symptoms

- headache
- · dizzy or fainting
- · heavy sweating
- cold, pale and clammy skin
- nausea or vomiting
- · fast, weak pulse
- · weakness or muscle cramps
- · excessive thirst

What to do

- · Hydrate with water or sports drinks. No alcohol.
- · Move to a cooler, air-conditioned place.
- · Lie down.
- · If fully conscious, sip water.
- Take a cool shower or use cold compresses.
- If vomiting continues, seek medical attention.
- Act quickly. Untreated heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke.
- Remove tight fitting clothing or extra layers



Heat Stroke - Medical Emergency

Symptoms

- · headache
- · confusion or delirium
- · may lose consciousness
- no sweating/dry skin
- · hot, red skin
- · nausea or vomiting
- · rapid heart rate
- body temperature above 104° F

What to do

- Call 911. This is a medical emergency.
- · Move the person to a cooler place.
- Use cold compresses to reduce body temperature.
- Do not give fluids
