Howdy Pards,

August is already here, and Range war is less than a month away. Lots of details below, hope you don't think it's too long winded.

Free Membership Shoot:

The free shoot and membership meeting went well. We had 43 shooters shoot the match and a few other members at the meeting. We discussed the financials which continue to hold strong. At the end of 2022 we were able to basically break even for the year, which includes membership, Range War and Bloody porch. **Hey Sugar and Old Doc Potter** took home this year's clean match awards. We are also holding our membership level, gaining just as many new members as we have lost over the last year. Approximately 95% of our members are also SASS members.

We had some discussion about the future of Range War and where it could be held in the coming years. The outcome is that <u>we would have another meeting at the Saturday Brecken-</u><u>ridge shoot in August</u>. This will be an open forum meeting where we discuss pros and cons for future locations.

The executive board will then put together a "request for proposal" or "RFP" which will detail the requirements that any club would need to provide or provide answers to. This RFP will be mailed to each club contact at every Wolverine Rangers club. Each club can then provide a proposal to the rangers, in a defined time, to request their club be in the mix for hosting a future Range War.

To be clear, we have a contract thru 2024 Range War to be held at Bluewater Sportsman's Club in Port Huron. So, we do have time to discuss all possibilities, and select the best location for the 2025 season. That would also include any proposal from Bluewater to keep Range War at their club. We hope that each club that has interest will reply with a proposal to the Wolverine Rangers to review.

RANGE WAR: Enough about the future, what about this year's 25th anniversary celebration?

Stage writing contest: Well, this was successful in bringing in plenty of stages to review. We had over 70 stages submitted. When the dust cleared, and we pulled out all the duplicates we had 44 stages left. These 44 stages went out anonymously labeled by number and sent out to our eleven stage committee members. Each committee member selected ~15 of these stages that they would like to see at Range War. Once we tallied the results, we had 12 stages that stood out from the pack of 44. The final ten were selected out of these 12 that best fit our targets and props. These are now off to the publisher with the rest of the shooter's handbook.

Thank you to all that submitted stages.

Stage Sponsorship: To date, we have 10 stage sponsors. Each stage sponsor will receive advertising/recognition space in the shooter's handbook as well as signage on the stage.

Golf cart rentals: The forms to sign up for a golf cart are on the website. We currently have 5 golf carts left for rent. Please fill out a form or call **Carolina Belle** to reserve one.

- 1. The camping permit was approved!! Each camper will receive an email with the suggestions for parking and safety measures suggested/recommended by the township.
- 2. On Friday there will be an RO class, likely ROI. **Sarge** will be reaching out to all of those that showed interest on their application. Please lets us know if you would like to be added to the list.
- 3. On Saturday evening after "Cowboy Trap" we will have a FARO demonstration in the clubhouse. Grey Hare will be bringing in three FARO tables for us to learn how to play and we will have three dealers set up to allow you to try your hand at this classic old west game. Also, in clubhouse during the FARO games will be an Ice

NEW INFO / CHANGES for RANGE WAR 2023 (continued):

- 4. On Sunday after the match, we will have a man on man shoot off. All that want to play are invited. More details will be provided at registration but bring some extra ammo.
- 5. The round count for the main match and all mini matches will be posted this week on our website.
- 6. Lunch on Friday and Saturday. We are going to try something different this year. We will have lunch available in the air-conditioned clubhouse on Friday and Saturday. Just come on up to the clubhouse and join us. This will be on a donation basis. More info will be sent out to each shooter prior to the match.

Shootout at Bloody Porch:

This a two-day shoot this year. Details and registration forms are on our website. We have reviewed the feedback from our inaugural match in 2022 and have made some changes.

We will have five stages on Saturday and five stages on Sunday. Side matches to be held Saturday after the match and lunch. Dinner will be in the clubhouse later in the evening on Saturday night. Sunday luncheon and awards will be in the air-conditioned clubhouse. This year we will have stages with less movement, and more typical to what you would see in our wild bunch stages at the Range War mini matches. This will not be a run and gun marathon, nor will it require more than the usual amount of ammo on any stage. The super stage and tons of knockdowns that must be reset by hand will not be used this year. There will be a few here and there, but they will not be the norm. The intent is to have fun, enjoy the shoot, not be exhausted and depleted at the end of the day.

We have about one month until the registration cutoff, Sept. 4th, for us to get badges, awards, handbooks, shirts, towels, etc. made in time for the shoot. If you plan to register, please do so, it greatly impacts our planning process. Note for those camping, there is a shower in the clubhouse that is available for use.

Know the Difference Between Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke

Heat Exhaustion	Heat Stroke – Medical Emergency
Symptoms • headache • dizzy or fainting • heavy sweating • cold, pale and clammy skin • nausea or vomiting • fast, weak pulse • weakness or muscle cramps • excessive thirst What to do • Hydrate with water or sports drinks. No alcohol. • Move to a cooler, air-conditioned place. • Lie down. • If fully conscious, sip water. • Take a cool shower or use cold compresses. • If vomiting continues, seek medical attention. • Act quickly. Untreated heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke. • Remove tight fitting clothing or extra layers	Symptoms • headache • confusion or delirium • may lose consciousness • no sweating/dry skin • hot, red skin • nausea or vomiting • rapid heart rate • body temperature above 104° F What to do • Call 911. This is a medical emergency. • Move the person to a cooler place. • Use cold compresses to reduce body temperature. • Do not give fluids
