## ★ Captain's Corner ★

#### Hello everyone,

It has been a rough couple of months since Range War. I didn't have a chance to put together an epitaph article for October. Although Kid Danger and I were able to attend the Shootout at Stoney Bottom, and High Noon at Tusco the health of my family took a toll on all of us. I am usually not this open about family, but I feel I need to today. My mom has been having health troubles for quite a while. On side match day of Range War, she was taken to the emergency room. Without getting into details, she stayed in the hospital for almost two weeks, followed by three weeks in a medical rehab hospital facility. She wasn't able to return home until October. My dad, who you know as *Three Deuces McKee*, spent most of this time visiting with my mom in the hospital or rehab facility. All the while trying to keep his health in check.

Three Deuces was in serious need of an Aorta Valve replacement and had worsening congestive heart failure. But my parents loved each other very much and spent every day together. They were married for 54+ years. He had spent much of July, August and September going through all the different doctors' appointments, tests, etc.... to get all the clearances needed to have the procedure. A truly gut-wrenching amount of time that it takes to get to see all the docs needed to get the approvals. He was finally scheduled to get the valve replacement on Tuesday October 14<sup>th</sup>.








## ★ Captain's Corner ★

On Monday the 13<sup>th</sup>, he walked into the testing facility to get his final blood drawn before the surgery the next day. He made it into the lobby of the facility and collapsed on the floor. At the time they thought it was a heart attack and he was revived with CPR and taken to the trauma center. After he was stabilized, overnight, they admitted him to the cardiac care unit. He was able to speak to us on Tuesday, and we had a good visit with him. Thank you to the Munson Hospital caregivers for letting me stay past visiting hours to be with him. Thank you to Crazy Mingo for visiting him on Tuesday, he was so happy to see you. He kept telling me how he wished that the surgery would be successful so that he could shoot Cowboy Action again, and how much he missed it and his cowboy family. Three Deuces McKee only missed three Range Wars out of 27, all three were due to heart surgeries.

On Wednesday he started to take a turn. He was not himself and didn't look well. Test after test, medication after medication, we did not know what was happening. After Wednesday evening he was not able to speak to us anymore. Finally, the doctors found the root cause, he had a massive brain aneurysm. We will never know if this caused his collapse and heart attack or if it happened during the fall from the heart attack. The neurosurgeons performed brain surgery to try to fix the aneurysm. We waited for days for him to wake up after the surgery, but he did not. On Monday October 20<sup>th</sup> he passed away with his family by his side.

A remembrance celebration will be held later, and information will be posted when it has been decided. Three Deuces Mckee loved cowboy action, the cowboy family, the game and doing so with his family. He was so happy to shoot with JC Wade, Kid Danger, and myself as well as my brother-in-law the few times he was able to shoot with us. I wouldn't be in cowboy action if it wasn't for my dad. Lastly to support the sport he loved, we ask that donations be made in his name to the SASS Scholarship Fund, in lieu of flowers, etc.

They will include the new mailing address. All mail in applications from members will need to be sent to the new address. Let's also welcome River Runner to this new role for her.

### **Huron River Regulators**

For our November shoot on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> we welcomed 19 shooters. We had five fun stages that kept everyone smiling, with a few bonus targets thrown in, literally. At the end of the day **Riverview Rattler** took the lead. Congratulations. Scores are on the Rangers website.

The Huron River Regulators will be shooting next on Saturday December 13<sup>th</sup>. We have plenty of propane heaters to go around as needed. Based on the weather we can shoot from cover or out on the range. We will have five stages, with three set-ups.

Our winter shoots starting in January will be on the first Sunday of the month through March. Then we will move back to our normal shooting season with shoots on the first Saturday of the month. The move to Sunday is due to our rather large Junior Archery program that we run on Saturdays. Each match will have a home cooked warm meal in the clubhouse after the shoot. During the winter we plan to have five stage matches. Weather dependent we can shoot from under cover or out on the bay, this call will be made a couple of days ahead of each match. We will continue to try to post the stages for each match about a week ahead of time on Facebook.

We will continue to hold Wild Bunch matches in 2026. But we may move to a sign up ahead of time format to gauge interest. Or add a mini match after our cowboy shoots, like we did last month.

Our "Second Annual" SASS Sponsored Duel at the Peninsular Paper Dam will be June 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026.

We will have camping, with plenty of electrical hookups. A Friday afternoon mini match, and a ten-stage main match. A potluck style dinner on Friday Night, Lunch and Dinner on Saturday as well as an Awards lunch following the match on Sunday. The applications will be ready in the coming weeks and posted on our Facebook page, website and the Rangers website.

New for 2026 our home club will be hosting PCC or Pistol Caliber Carbine matches. These will be a mix of rules from different disciplines, but they will be stages where you shoot steel with scenarios similar to cowboy action/wild bunch scenarios. For anyone that has shot this as a side match at the Kentucky state shoot, you know how much fun it can be. It gives us another reason to use our steel, props, tables, etc. that we have for cowboy action on a different day with different guns. We are excited to try it at Washtenaw. Rules are being worked on for our range and will be posted this winter. A schedule has been generated and will be posted after the first of the year.
